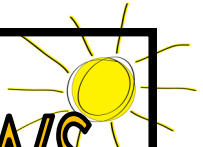




Bledisloe School News

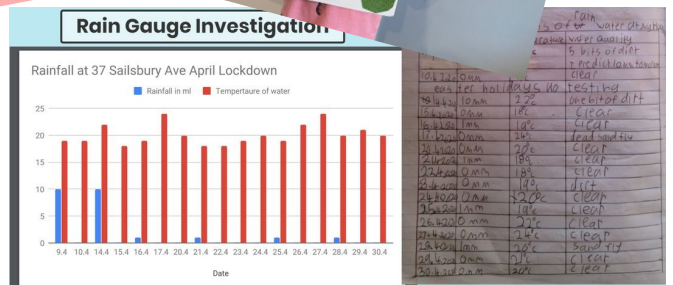
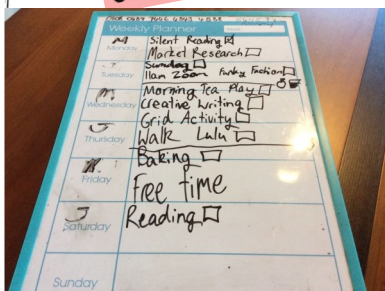
